There are Five Types of Discussion Topics

- 1) **Context:** Where the Whole is greater than the sum of its Parts.
- 2) **Concepts:** Relationships are more important than Details.
- 3) **Physical Systems:** That influence response.
- 4) **Societal Systems:** That influence Perspectives that result from Experience.
- 5) **Emotions:** That result from Feelings (PTSD: Military vs. Civilian vs. Student)
